



There was a brief program on the "habits of shells."


25 Years Ago





Membership: Donna Krusenoski was not present, therefore no report.

Field Trips: Gary Martinez was not present but sent a request for constructive feedback and suggestions for future field trips.

Web Page: Bruce Paulson was not present therefore no report.

Newsletter: Ron Bopp reported that next month's edition will have lots of pictures.

Education: Lisa Kinney reported on the Scotch Bonnet while wearing her own Scotch plaid beret.

Sunshine: Frankie Grover was not present, but it was suggested that notes be sent to Al Banko and Lynn Gaulin.

Artisans: Donna Bartels was not present, but Donna Cassin reported that the Artisans were working feverishly on items for the upcoming Sarasota County Fair.


Library Notes
