

KEEWAYDIN

SSC announces field trip to Keewaydin Island | Date: Tuesday, Jan. 24, 2023

Keewadyin Island is a barrier island located within the Rookery Bay National Estuarine Reserve. It is bordered by an inland waterway to the east and the Gulf of Mexico to the west. The Island is currently 15% privately owned and 85% public lands. The island is only accessible by boat - there are no cars, bridges, or roads which keep the beaches, waters, and land primitive. A variety of wildlife is able to reproduce and occupy the island such as white-tailed deer, wild boar, sea turtles, birds, seashells, crabs, wild plants, and grasses. In order to keep this land pristine, there are numerous conservatory efforts ongoing so it is important that visitors treat and respect the island as they would their own. It is crucial that all garbage and waste is taken off the island with you. Do not take any live seashells and do not cut or pull out any vegetation. Summertime is turtle nesting season, please make sure you stay on the designated paths and do not disturb or touch any of the nests.

A Favorite Trip

- Each of the last few years, the club has made a very successful field trip to the island
- The extensive exposed flats and shallow inlet provide a remarkable opportunity to see both living mollusks and collect empty shells
- The island is accessible only by boat. We have been using the very reliable Hemingway Water Shuttle out of the Rose Marina on Marco Island




Details of the Trip


- The boat will leave the marina no later than 7:30 am on Tuesday, January 24.
- There is ample parking at the marina
- The ride out provides an opportunity to observe other early risers enjoying the outdoors as well as land and marine wildlife in the mangroves.
- At 7:30, it will be dark and possibly quite cool, so dress accordingly. You most likely will want to wade in the inlet and runnels which contain sharp pieces of shell. Wear foot gear with sturdy soles.
- Shellers frequently find large whelk and horse conch shells so it's a good idea to have a container big enough to hold them such as 5 gallon bucket.
- We will get a time to be back on the boat between 11:00 am and 12:00 noon.
- Many participants choose to stay for lunch together. There are good places to eat within walking distance of the marina.



- The cost will be \$52.10 per person. This does not include the tip. Please make your check payable to Sarasota Shell Club and give it to Allen Banko, either in person or mail it to him at P.O. Box 4124, Sarasota, FL 34230-4124. Checks must be received by December 8 and are non-refundable unless the trip is canceled by the club or the boat captain. In the event you have paid and are unable to go you will be responsible to find an alternate to go and refund your payment directly to you. Also, make sure your club membership is paid.

- Val, of Hemingway Water Shuttle, would like to know as soon as possible how many people from Sarasota Shell Club plan to go on the trip, so please reserve your spot promptly and notify Gary Martinez of your intentions. The boat holds up to 20 people after which we will create a wait list.

November 10, 2022, 7:00 p.m.

- The meeting was called to order by President Duane Kauffmann at 7 p.m. Twenty-nine members and 1 guest were present.
- The president welcomed the group and thanked them for coming so soon after the passage of Tropical Storm Nicole.
- 3. The program was given by Amy Bentley (assisted by Gary Martinez) members of SSC. The program focused on their attendance at Shell Camp on Kice Island. Photographs of the camp and shelling sites were provided along with narration about camp experiences. Club members responded positively to such a shell immersive experience. The downsides appear to be no-see-ums and cost.
- The extended break allowed for silent auction bids and sign-ups for shell show and field trips.
- 5. The raffle was held early to accommodate personnel involved.
- 6. Treasurer's report indicated good month and a balance of \$23,721.
- The education report by Bradford Andrews was cancelled due to illness. He will report in January.
- Nancy Cadieux noted the sign-up for the Christmas party at Bird Key Yacht Club. She also solicited volunteers for the shell show.
- The upcoming field trips were noted, including 3 trips on the Carefree Learner.

- The artisans report they are "working."
- 11. The interview with Beverly Root focused on her regrets at overlooking collecting options when she was younger and her favorite shelling sites and experiences.
- 12. The science minute report focused on (a) the a recent report of a 507 year old cold water clam, and (b) the body of research showing that the increasing acidity of marine waters may make it difficult for shelled species to build adequate shells.
- Interspersed in the above activities were brief reports/announcements/requests concerning: (a) COA meeting in late May in Wilmington, NC, (b) the need for club secretary, historian, shell show volunteers.

The Experience

- There is an \$8 fee per vehicle to enter the park, \$4 for unaccompanied drivers.
- We will gather at 8:15 a.m. in the parking lot on the north side of the public restrooms building between Oasis Beach and the North Beach (last parking lot).
- A negative low tide will occur at approximately 9:00 am. This beach can get busy especially near the parking lots, so it will be important to be out there as early as possible.
- Shells may be found by beachcombing and wading in the shallow water.
- At 11:00 we can gather for lunch at Café Honeymoon, the park's food service, offering beach-style food and alcohol, or one of the near-by eateries across the causeway, such as Café al Fresco or Hurricane Eddy's. Check out the menus and let me know if you have a preference or would like to suggest another place.

Honeymoon Island is a barrier island just north of Caladesi Island in Dunedin. It is joined to the mainland by a causeway and has been a state park since 1981. This largely undeveloped island is home to endangered species of plants, as well as many kinds of birds. Rattlesnakes have been found to inhabit the interior. Offshore, seagrass beds provide shelter for many kinds o mollusks and other sea life, which frequently wash ashore.

Options


- Visit the park website to get a good idea of the activities and services the park offers.
- There are miles of beach to explore, including sandy stretches, as well as stony patches and areas studded with sharp spikes. If you enter these areas make sure you have appropriate footwear and use extreme caution to avoid injury. Always look before you step and don't get distracted by shiny objects.



Historic shell prints from *A Conchological Manual*, circa 1839






November Meeting Memories
