

### Meeting Minutes

### Bee Ridge Presbyterian Church

January 12, 2023, 7:00 p.m.

- 1. The meeting was called to order by President Duane Kauffmann at 7 p.m. Twenty-four members and two guests were present.
- 2. The program was given by Dr. Sandra Gilchrist who reported on her work (some with students supported by SSC) in Sarasota Bay and in Honduras. The work in Sarasota Bay concerned microplastics in the food chain, the presence of microplastics in invertebrate eggs, and the various sampling procedures used in data collection. The Honduras work had hermit crabs and octopuses as the central research focus. There were many questions and the report was very well received.
- 3. No additions or corrections to the minutes of the previous meeting were noted.
- 4. In the absence of treasurer Allan Banko, it was reported the current balance is \$19,585.
- 5. Upcoming field trips are to Keywaydin and Kice Island. The Kice trip is reported as full; space may be available to Keywaydin.
- 6. The education report was by Bradford Andrews on a murex.
- 7. The Interview was with Karen Huether, a microbiologist by training, but a shell collector by avocation. She reported that her childhood home in Oklahoma was not an ideal location for a shell collector. She identified the family Muricidae as her favorite.
- 8. The science report concerned the decline in seagrass acreage in Sarasota Bay. Although above 1980s levels, it is less than 5 years ago. The downtrend is slowing and will hopefully soon be reversed.
- 9. No new business was brought to the floor.
- 10. Carol Mae gave brief updates on Mardi Gras, the food at shell show, and a potential prize for food volunteers at the Shell Show.
- 11. The raffle concluded the meeting.
- 12. Adjourned.
