

Commentary ...

A Tribute to Tom Watters

It was with deep sadness that I learned of the passing of curator, husband, malacologist, field biologist, father, and friend, Tom Watters at age 66. Losing Tom far too early deprives the science of malacology and the community of shell enthusiasts of a brilliant taxonomist and a wonderful friend.

I had the privilege of learning to know Tom on a trip led by Peggy Williams. He was one of the best field biologists I have ever encountered, knowledgeable about terrestrial, marine, and freshwater, snails and bivalves. Although the literature in the science of memory suggests even the best can only retain around 600 scientific names, Tom must surely have exceeded that by two or three standard deviations.

Indeed I hold Tom responsible for my interest in terrestrial snails. Two

examples: 1. On a Peggy W trip, I was Tom's roommate. He disappeared. I went to find him and discovered him behind the hotel on his knees digging in the leaf litter. I wondered why and he soon had me digging in nearby leaf detritus to find the small terrestrial snails he knew would be there. 2. On a trip to Eleuthera we had to stop frequently (very frequently) to collect the land snails of genus *Cerion*. Tom said the literature indicated 17 species (or subspecies) on the island from north to south. He was determined to find them all!

I always enjoyed hearing about Tom's work on

endangered freshwater mussels in both formal speeches and around-thetable conversations. Those informal conversations were especially delightful, for Tom had a wonderful sense of humor. After discussing malacology, I would always try to bait him into describing his encounters with, and descriptions of, airline security personnel and/or university bureaucrats. His descriptive skewers were delightful.

All who knew him will miss Tom immensely and I send my deepest

condolences to his wife and three young adult children. On this sad occasion I will note that THE Ohio State University has lost a great employee (even if I will continue to insist it is equally THE University of Illinois as well!).


