
Library Notes






Some Sad News

Unfortunately as this issue is ready for distribution a couple of items have surfaced that are of interest to members. First, within the last week, we have heard that Harry Lee has suffered a stroke and is now just beginning the recovery process. Many members are familiar with Harry as he has judged our show in the past as well as being the Past-President of the COA. Harry was to judge our current shell show in February. In the last couple of days we have been informed of the death of Alan Gettleman. Alan recently gave a talk for our club (September, 2023). Besides his expansive involvement with the COA (recently Historian but also Past-President) Alan was a friend of Mary Jo and me. He often stayed with us when in Bradenton. When Mary Jo missed out on a bid of shells (Alan had donated for use in a silent auction at a COA convention a few years ago) Alan promptly mailed over a batch of over 30 similar shells for her. He was a fan of our Goldin, Gracie, and often asked about her in our conversations.

Pictured here is a photo taken in Guaymas. He had just received a couple of very large crabs . . . later they had to be dismantled in order to carry in his luggage for the trip home.



Alan was a character as well as very well-versed about seashells especially land snails. Our mutual friend, and presenter for our January meeting, Clair Beckman, noted on Facebook today the following (thanks, Clair for letting me reprint this):

So absent minded that in one trip he lost the car keys for hours (as it turns out they were in his pocket during the entire very frantic search in Guaymas) then his boarding pass about five minutes before final call. Met him on a Bahamas trip that featured live land snails captured and then released and crawling all over his room. He was gentle, funny, giving, smarter than smart, and someone who talked non-stop, but had much to share. He got all the way to the bridge one trip and forgot his asthma drugs so he drove all the way to Merritt Island again and back to our place. We planned to see him on our trip to Melbourne in a few weeks and had emailed him yesterday not knowing about his death.
