

He manages Mote's education technologies such as distance learning studies and computer lab and connect schools and organizations to Mote's STEM experts through virtual programs.


His presentation will be on discussing how Mote Marine Laboratory is pioneering efforts to save Florida's Coral Reefs with the first Caribbean King


