



Happy New Year to all. Hope everyone had a wonderful holiday season. We have a fantastic speaker for our upcoming January 9th Sarasota Shell Club general meeting. Our Speaker is Dr. Emily Lancaster who is currently a Professor of Marine Biology at Eckerd College in St. Petersburg, Florida.

Her focus/research is on invertebrate zoology and environmental DNA. She has a Bachelor from Pepperdine University, a Master's from Moss Landing Marine Laboratories/Cal State, Monterey Bay, California and her PhD from University of Maine. Emily spends most of her time in the classroom teaching students or in her research labs but also spends much of her free time wandering tide pools look-



ing for sea slugs (her personal favorites) and other mollusks. Emily recently took the position at Eckerd College and we are really fortunate to have her come to speak to us at our January meeting. Please invite your family and friends to hear and speak to Dr. Lancaster at our meeting. Looking forward to seeing everyone and enjoying listening to an expert in the field of Marine Biology. #### **SUMMARY OF EACH VOLUNTEERING OPPORTUNITY**

**Tablecloths**: one time only for a few hours. Cover each table (excluding vendor tables) with a tablecloth and secure with binder clips.

**Loading the truck from the church**: A few hours. Follow instructions from the Artisans and from Duane. Men are welcomed for heavier items.

**Unloading the truck at the show and set-up:** Often done by the same crew who loaded the truck and many more. Unloading items and bringing them to the designated table. The Chairman of each table will provide instructions.

**Awards table set-up**: assemble the award ribbons on sticks planted on a base. Instructions provided by Linda Greiner.

**Lunch Area**: assist Chairman with the kitchen set-up, distributing the sandwiches/snacks/drinks and checking the list of volunteers and vendors receiving a lunch.

**Entrance/Admission:** Extremely busy table. People's first impression of the Sarasota Shell Club. Must be a very personable individual to volunteer. Chairman collects the money for the admission, volunteers give "People's Choice" ballots (2), a door prize ticket, and a little bag of shells to paid attendees. These volunteers maintain a log of admissions.

**Artisans table**: Show the beautiful Artisans' creations, state the prices and wrap up the purchases. Chairman handles \$\$\$.

**Children Education Table:** games and exhibits readily available to interact with children.

No shell show experience necessary. Very basic knowledge of shells is required (elementary school level).

**Guard of the Artistic Exhibits:** Answers questions about the exhibits & categories of ribbons, walks around the table or sits in a spot where he/she can watch the public looking at the exhibits and if needed to, quickly discouraging anyone from touching them as all are fragile. Visitors are frequently tempted to touch the exhibits...

**Awards packing**: one volunteer 1 volunteer collects & packs the sticks and the bases on Saturday afternoon after 3:45 P.M.

**Club Table**: answer questions, sell the shells that were donated to our club by private collectors & accept payment. Incredible finds are possible at discounted prices for the treasure hunters.

**Membership**: A perfect fit for a person who really loves our SSC. Answer questions about the club activities, membership fees, method of payment and provide brochure. Detailed written information will be provided to those volunteers.

**Raffle table**: Explain how the raffle works re: the drawing will be on Saturday at 4:00 P.M. and there is no need to be present to win. Sell tickets (detailed fees & instructions provided). Usually it is quite busy.

**Volunteers at large**: **super helpful if we are in a pinch**. Sign-up for the day and shift that you are available if you have no preference.
